The Jubilee Ministry of the Episcopal Diocese of Missouri is launching a food truck this month. The **Just**Food truck goes into areas of high food insecurity to offer meals to those who are hungry. Beginning the week of Oct. 22, there will be three 2-hour stops each week in North City, South City and Downtown.


Starting in November the **Just**Food will visit parishes throughout the diocese as a way to tell the story of food injustices in every area of our diocese, urban,

Parishioner, Paul Reuter, is program coordinator for Arts & Faith St. Louis. They will host the 13th annual Interfaith Concert at The Sheldon Concert Hall on Sunday, October 15, 2023 at 4:30 pm.

The concert will include music from nine faith communities - Catholic, Protestant, Jewish, Muslim, Hindu, Sikh, Buddhist, Baha'i, and Latter-Day Saints, and performances by soprano Christine Brewer with The Sheldon's All Star Chorus (high school students from St. Louis City and County), Opera Theatre soprano Angel Love (formerly Angel Riley), and the Interfaith Youth Chorus.
